

SAINT MERCURIUS: A CHRISTIAN SOLDIER

he military played a major role in the life of people of the first century.

Armies affected every person and every aspect of life in those years. It is no wonder, then, that Saint Paul in writing to the faithful of Ephesus speaks in military terms and bids them to fight evil as in a battle.

St. Paul writes: "My brethren, be strong in the Lord, and in the power of His might . . . Take unto yourselves the whole armor of God . . . Stand, therefore, having your loins girt about with truth, and having on the breastplate of righteousness . . . Above all, taking the shield of faith . . . and take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit which is the Word of God . . ." The great Apostle points to the foes of salvation, Satan and his wiles, endlessly attacking the believer. Certainly his words have relevance in our day as well. We are confronted each day by the secular forces of our materialistic culture. We, too, must arm ourselves as if in battle!

A number of soldiers of the early centuries of the Church, upon hearing the Gospel of Christ and seeing the virtuous lives of believers, embraced the Christian faith. Some did so secretly. One such soldier is the saint and martyr MERCURIUS. He was a warrior in the mighty Roman Army of the third century, who successfully fought the barbarians and became a great hero of the day. In fact, he is said to have been named a general by Emperor Decius. But some envious officers found out that he was a Christian and betrayed him to the emperor. Mercurius refused to deny his faith in Christ and to pray to the pagan gods of the Romans. He was martyred around the year 253.

+EPISTLE+ (Galatians 6:11-18) Brethren: See with what large letters I have written to you with my own hand! As many as desire to make a good showing in the flesh, those would compel you to be circumcised, only that they may not suffer persecution for the cross of Christ. For not even those who are circumcised keep the law, but they desire to have you circumcised that they may boast in your flesh. But God forbid that I should boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world. For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision nor uncircumcision avails anything, but a new creation. And as many as walk according to this rule, peace and mercy be upon them, and upon the Israel of God. From now on let no one trouble me, for I bear in my body the marks of the Lord Jesus. Brethren, the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with your spirit. Amen.

+GOSPEL+ (Luke 12:16-21) Then He spoke a parable to them, saying: "The ground of a certain rich man yielded plentifully.
